Consent

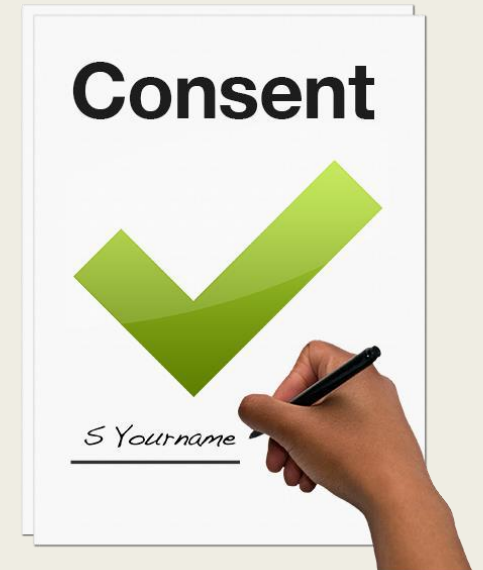
Giving permission to be filmed, photographed or quoted.

Informed Consent

- Determine capacity – does the person understand
- Ensure Easy Read information and forms
- People can change their mind about consent
at anytime -withdraw or revoke

- Payment or reimbursement

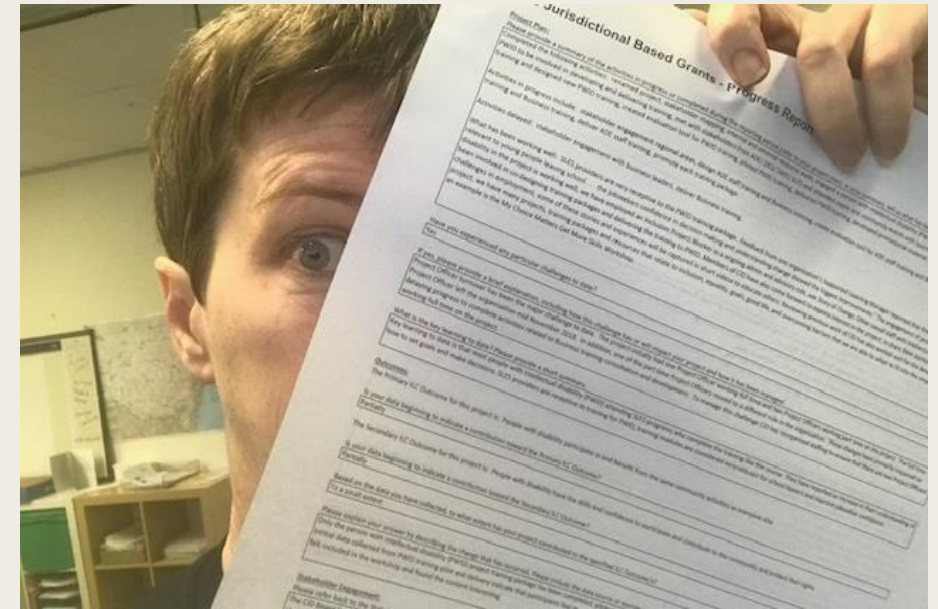
